Subject: Important update from the Superintendent on the DESE school mask mandate

REMINDER: School Mask Mandate to be Lifted on February 28

Effective Monday, February 28th, the DESE mask requirement will be lifted statewide.

Students and staff in the Whitman-Hanson Regional School District will no longer need to wear masks when returning to school from February break.

Masks will still be required in all school clinics.

As always, any individual who wishes to continue to mask should be supported in that choice.

DESE will be lifting indoor mask requirements for K-12 and child care settings on February 28, 2022. On February 9, 2022, Jeffrey C. Riley, DESE Commissioner, announced that, after consulting with medical experts and state health officials, he will not renew the state mask requirement after it expires on February 28, 2022.

In addition, late Friday, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) announced that, effective February 25, 2022, it is no longer requiring that masks be worn on school buses or vans for K-12 students and children in childcare programs.

DESE and DPH strongly recommend students and staff continue to follow the <u>DESE-DPH Protocols for Responding to COVID-19 Scenarios</u>.

As always, any individual who wishes to continue to mask, including those who face higher risk from COVID-19, should be supported in that choice. DESE and DPH strongly recommend unvaccinated individuals should continue to wear masks in school settings. The Commissioner will continue to monitor public health data, consult with medical experts and state health officials, and issue further guidance and/or requirements as needed.
